Jesus denounces key Galilean cities

EVENT 37

Jesus is confronted on two occasions by the Pharisees who demand a sign

- First occasion (Mt. 12:38-42; Lk. 11:29-32)
- Second occasion (Mt. 16:14; Mk. 8:10-12; Lk. 12:34-58)

EVENT 38

Jesus has two encounters with His family

- First encounter (Mt. 12:46-48; Mk. 3:31-35; Lk. 8:19-21)
- Second encounter (Jn. 7:1-10)

EVENT 39

Jesus meets with the rich young ruler (Mt. 19:16-26; Mk. 10:17-22)

EVENT 40

Jesus delivers the maniac of Gadara (Mk. 5:1-20)

EVENT 41

Jesus heals a woman with an issue of blood (Mt. 9:20-22; Mk. 5:25-34; Lk. 8:43-48)

EVENT 42

Jesus raises Jairus' daughter (Mt. 9:18-19, 23-26; Mk. 5:22-24, 35-43; Lk. 8:41-42, 49-56)

EVENT 43

Jesus is transfigured (Mt. 17:1-13; Lk. 9:28-36)

Jesus delivers a demonic son (Mt. 17:14-18; Mk. 9:14-29; Lk. 9:38-42)

Jesus relates the parable of the Good Samaritan (Lk. 10:30-37)

EVENT 46

Jesus relates the parable of the lost sheep, coin, and son (Lk. 15:1-32)

EVENT 47

Jesus relates the parable of the rich man and Lazarus (Lk. 16:19-31)

EVENT 48

Jesus forgives the woman taken in the act of adultery (Jn. 8:1-11)

EVENT 49

Jesus preaches His sermon on the Good Shepherd and his sheep (Jn. 10:1-21)

EVENT 50

Jesus heals the man born blind (Jn. 9)

EVENT 51

Jesus predicts His sufferings, death, and resurrection on three important occasions

- First occasion: After hearing Peter's confession (Mt. 16:21-23; Mk. 8:31-33; Lk. 9:22)
- Second occasion: After the Transfiguration (Mt. 17:22-23; Mk. 9:30-32; Lk. 9:43-45)
- Third occasion: Just prior to His final week (Mt. 20:17-19; Mk. 10:32-34; Lk. 18:31-34)

EVENT 52

Jesus raises Lazarus from the dead (Jn. 11:1-44)

EVENT 53

Jesus cleanses the lepers (Lk. 17:11-19)

EVENT 54

Jesus rebukes James and John on three occasions

- First occasion, for sectarianism (Mk. 9:38-41; Lk. 9:49-50)
- Second occasion, for barbarism (Lk. 9:51-56)
- Third occasion, for egotism (Mt. 20:20-28; Mk. 10:35-45)

EVENT 55

Jesus blesses some little children (Mt. 19:13-15; Mk. 10:13-16; Lk. 18:15-17)

EVENT 56

Jesus heals blind Bartimaeus (Mt. 20:29-34; Mk. 10:46-52; Lk. 18:35-43)

EVENT 57

Jesus calls down Zacchaeus from a sycamore tree (Lk. 19:1-10)

EVENT 58

Jesus is anointed by Mary of Bethany (Mt. 26:6-13; Mk. 14:3-9; Jn. 12:1-8)

EVENT 59

Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem (Mt. 21:1-11; Mk. 11:1-10; Lk. 19:29-38; Jn. 12:12-19)

EVENT 60

Jesus performs His second temple cleansing (Mt. 21:12-17; Mk. 11:15-18; Lk. 19:45-47)

EVENT 61

Jesus curses the fig tree (Mt. 21:18-19)

EVENT 62

Jesus hears the voice of His Father for the third and final time

- First occasion: At His baptism (Mt. 3:16-17)
- Second occasion: At His transfiguration (Mt. 17:1-5)
- Third occasion: After the request by some Greeks to see Jesus (Jn. 12:20-33)

EVENT 63

Jesus is subjected to the final of five confrontations by the wicked Pharisees and Sadducees

- Over His authority (Mt. 21:23-27; Mk. 11:27-33; Lk. 20:3-8)
- Over paying tribute to Caesar (Mt. 22:15-22; Mk. 12:13-17; Lk. 20:19-25)
- Over the doctrine of the resurrection (Mt. 22:23-33; Mk. 12:18-27; Lk. 20:27-40)
- Over the greatest commandment (Mt. 22:34-40; Mk. 12:28-34)
- Over the Messiah (Mt. 22:41-46; Mk. 12:35-37; Lk. 20:41-44)

EVENT 64

Jesus utterly condemns the wicked Pharisees (Mt. 23:1-36; Mk. 12:38-40; Lk. 20:45-47)

EVENT 65

Jesus weeps over the city of Jerusalem for the final time

- First occasion (Mt. 23:37-39; Lk. 13:34-35)
- Second occasion (Lk. 19:41-44)

EVENT 66

Jesus commends a poor widow for her sacrificial gift (Mk. 12:41-44; Lk. 21:1-4)

EVENT 67

Jesus delivers His Mt. Olivet Discourse (Mt. 24:1-51)

EVENT 68

Jesus makes preparation for the Passover (Mt. 26:17-19; Mk. 14:12-16; Lk. 22:7-13)

EVENT 69

Jesus washes the disciples' feet, institutes the Lord's Supper, and announces His betrayal in the Upper Room (Mt. 26:17-39; Mk. 14:12-25; Lk. 22:7-30; Jn. 13-14)

EVENT 70

Jesus delivers His fruit bearing sermon (Jn. 15-16)

EVENT 71

Jesus prays His Great High Priestly Prayer (Jn. 17)

EVENT 72

Jesus offers up three prayers in great agony in Gethsemane (Mt. 26:36-46; Mk. 14:32-42; Lk. 22:39-46; Jn. 18:1-11)

EVENT 73

Jesus is betrayed by Judas Iscariot

- The bargain - Judas agrees to sell Jesus out for 30 pieces of silver (Mt. 26:14-16; Mk. 14:10-11; Lk. 22:3-6)
- The betrayal - Judas betrays Jesus in Gethsemane (Mt. 26:43-50; Lk. 22:47-48; Jn. 18:1-5)
- The bloody field - Judas returns the money and hangs himself. The 30 pieces are used to purchase a field called the field of blood. (Mt. 27:3-10)

EVENT 74

Jesus restores a severed ear in Gethsemane (Mt. 26:51-56; Mk. 14:47-49; Lk. 22:50-51; Jn. 18: 10-11)

EVENT 75

Jesus is arrested in Gethsemane (Jn. 18:10)

EVENT 76

Jesus is forsaken by all in Gethsemane (Mt. 26:56; Mk. 14:50-52)

EVENT 77

Jesus suffers His unfair and illegal trials

- The Jewish, religious trials
 1. The three-fold travesty during these trials (the denunciation by Annas, Caiaphas, and the Sanhedrin)
 - a. Christ stands before Annas (Jn. 18:13-14, 19-23)
 - b. Christ stands before Caiaphas (Mt. 26:57, 59-68; Mk. 14:53-65; Lk. 22:54, 63-65; Jn. 18:24)
 - c. Christ stands before the entire Sanhedrin (Mt. 27:1; Mk. 15:1)
 2. The two-fold tragedy during those trials (the denials of Peter and death of Judas)
 - a. The denials by Peter (Mt. 26:33-35, 69-73, 75; Mk. 14:29-31, 54, 66-70, 72; Lk. 22:31-34, 54-59, 61-62; Jn. 13:36-38; 18:15-17, 25-27)
 - b. The death of Judas (Mt. 27:3-10)
- The Roman, political trials
 1. Christ stands before Pilate (for the first time) (Mt. 27:2, 11-14; Mk. 15:25; Lk. 23:1-5; Jn. 18:28-38)
 2. Christ stands before Herod Antipas (Lk. 23:6-12)
 3. Christ stands before Pilate (for the final time) (Mt. 27:15-26; Lk. 15:6-15; 23:13-24; Jn. 18:40; 19:1, 4-5, 7-15)
- The military, mockery trial
Christ stands before the soldiers (Mt. 27:27-31; Mk. 15:16-20; Jn. 19:2-3)

EVENT 78

Jesus is brutally scourged (Mt. 27:26; Mk. 15:15)

EVENT 79

Jesus is led to Calvary

- The man of Cyrene, lifting up Jesus' cross (Mt. 27:32; Mk. 15:21; Lk. 23:26)
- The maidens of Jerusalem, lamenting over Jesus' cross (Lk. 23:27-31)

EVENT 80

Jesus is crucified between two thieves (Mt. 27:32-49; Mk. 15:25; Lk. 23:32; Jn. 19:16-18)

EVENT 81

Jesus makes seven statements while on the cross.

- The first three hours (9:00 am till Noon)
 1. First statement from the cross: "Father, forgive them; for they know not what they do." (Lk. 23:34)
 2. Second statement from the cross: "Verily I say unto thee, to day shalt thou be with me in paradise." (Lk. 23:43)

3. Third statement from the cross: "Woman, behold thy son! Behold thy mother." (Jn. 19:26-27)
- The final three hours (Noon till 3:00 pm)
4. Fourth statement from the cross: "My God, my God, why hast thou forsaken me." (Mt. 27:46)
5. Fifth statement from the cross: "I thirst." (Jn. 19:28)
6. Sixth statement from the cross: "It is finished." (Jn. 19:30)
7. Seventh statement from the cross: "Father, into thy hands I commend my spirit." (Lk. 23:46)

EVENT 82

Jesus dies on the cross (Mt. 27:50; Mk. 15:37; Lk. 23:46; Jn. 19:30)

EVENT 83

Jesus' body is pierced (Jn. 19:31-37)

EVENT 84

Jesus' death is accompanied by a series of miracles

- In regards to the temple: The veil is torn from top to bottom (Mt. 27:51; Mk. 15:38; Lk. 23:45)
- In regards to the terrain: A localized but severe earthquake occurred (Mt. 27:51)
- In regards to the tombs: A number of people were raised from the dead (Mt. 27:52-53)

EVENT 85

Jesus' body is claimed by and prepared for burial by Joseph of Arimathaea and Nicodemus (Mt. 27:57-59; Mk. 15:42-45; Lk. 23:50-52; Jn. 19:38-40)

EVENT 86

Jesus' body is placed in Joseph's tomb (Mt. 27:60; Mk. 15:46; Lk. 23:53; Jn. 19:41-42)

EVENT 87

Jesus' tomb is officially sealed (Mt. 27:62-66)

EVENT 88

Jesus is raised from the dead (Mt. 28:2-4; Mk. 16:4; Lk. 24:2; Jn. 20:6-7)

EVENT 89

Jesus appears to Mary Magdalene in the Garden (Mk. 16:9-10; Jn. 20:11-18)

EVENT 90

Jesus appears to some women returning from the tomb (Mt. 28:5-10)

EVENT 91

Jesus appears to two disciples on the Emmaus Road (Lk. 24:13-32; Mk. 16:12-13)

EVENT 92

Jesus appears to Peter in Jerusalem (Lk. 24:34; 1 Cor. 15:5)

EVENT 93

Jesus appears to ten of His apostles in the Upper Room (Mk. 16:14; Lk. 24:36-43; Jn. 20:19-23)

EVENT 94

Jesus appears to eleven of His apostles in the Upper Room (Jn. 20:19-29)

EVENT 95

Jesus appears to seven of His apostles by the Sea of Galilee (Jn. 21:1-23)

EVENT 96

Jesus appears to the eleven and 500 believers on Mt. Tabor (Mt. 28:16-20; 1 Cor. 15:6)

EVENT 97

Jesus appears to James His half-brother in Jerusalem (1 Cor. 15:7)

EVENT 98

Jesus appears to the eleven on Mt. Olivet (Lk. 24:44-50)

EVENT 99

Jesus instructs His apostles forty days after His resurrection (Acts 1:3)

EVENT 100

Jesus ascends to Heaven from Mt. Olivet (Mk. 16:19; Lk. 24:51; Acts 1:9)
